There will be approximately thirty girls, ranging in age from 9 to 16 years, participating in the camp. The 14- to 16-year olds will have a chance to work in leadership positions (e.g. Counselors in Training or CITs, assistant drama instructor, etc.), with mentoring from senior staff members. These teens completed "The Spring Leadership Training Program" hosted by Lyncroft for the Art of Hospitality (AOH) Teen Club to which they belong.

We will be offering activities such as hiking, swimming at a nearby beach, scavenger hunts, arts and crafts, drama, hands-on cooking classes, star-gazing, campfires and more.



Recognizing that Chipnee Trails is a good cause, the farmhouse owners allow us to use their property. The staff members are all young professionals donating their time and effort to be role models and provide the campers with a safe, fun and unforgettable weekend.



In order to make the camp available to girls who would otherwise not be able to enjoy this experience, we try to keep the cost of the camp low. To do this, we count on the generosity of donors and sponsors. We only charge what we need to break even.
